# NCRC Classic Update

## Registration:

- 119 for the Half Marathon
- 37 for the 10km
- (At this time in 2019 we had 41 HM/ 20 10K)

## Status:

- Umstead State Park approved our permit, I've paid, we have it in hand.
- Omega Sports North Hills agreed to sponsor the race this year and will be early packet pick up
- Red Storm and Hoganas have agreed to allow us to use the parking lots for runners

## To Do:

- Notify veterinary hospital (new building) near starting line
- Make reservations for DJ, Portajohns, rental equipment, EMT crew
- Reach out to volunteer groups for aid stations
- Schedule course recertification (see below)
- Submit City of Cary permit application

## Race HQ Redesign:

- I'm thinking of two possible new layouts for the start/finish, draw these up and solicit input
  - o Layout 1: Start/Finish near intersection with Winstead
  - o Layout 2: Start/Finish near veterinary hospital
- Move start finish further north on Old Reedy creek so we can allow runners to park in Hoganas lot
- Completely close Old Reedy Creek and have race headquarters (DJ, refreshments, near the start/finish)
